

Devastating effects of Storm Doris in the parish


No doubt many of you were affected by the ferocity of Storm Doris on 23rd February with trees and fences blown down, and the Parish Council was no exception.

A significant portion of a very large old Lime tree situated in the churchyard at St. Andrews church in Great Billing came down onto parish council owned land.

It damaged fencing at the top of The Leys, but more importantly a large section of the newly restored ha-ha wall was completely demolished.

Repairs to the fence and ha-ha wall will be carried out as soon as possible and it is hoped that by the time you read this newsletter works will be completed.

Arrangements were made to have the fallen tree removed the following day as it was deemed a safety hazard.

Many dignitaries attended the ceremony including the Mayor and Consort of Rushden, Mayor and Consort of Corby, Chairman of Daventry District Council and Deputy Mayor of Raunds, alongside former Mayors of Northampton, members of the Council and Freemen of the Borough.

Unfortunately, as so often happens with the British weather, it started to rain five minutes before the ceremony started but it failed to spoil a lovely occasion.

The Council thank Lynne for bestowing this honour on it and wish her and Christopher all the very best for the remainder of their Mayoral year.

You may recall that quite some time ago we advised parishioners that Billing Parish Council was hoping to acquire ownership of Bellinge Field. We are delighted to announce that this is finally coming to fruition and by the time you read this newsletter the transfer of ownership should be completed.

The Council is sure everyone will agree that we are extremely fortunate to have so much open green space within our parish and the acquisition of this additional green land means that this, together with the land already owned by the Parish Council, will never be built on and will remain in perpetuity as an open space for all parishioners to enjoy.

Bellinge Community House

WE have had a very productive time since the last newsletter. Our success stories include £36,000 of Debt Relief support provided by Ella, who assists any resident in the Parish that needs support with financial management. Ella is fully qualified to provide this monthly service, a satellite service from Community Law Service Northamptonshire.

We have had several groups develop and we hope that they continue to do so: IT Drop in session and Wi-Fi , Project ABC - Active Billing Community with Health Walks and Billing Joggers group; Make do and Mend sewing group with Lind Miller, a local resident who volunteers her time, IT for beginners, supporting those that would like to get used to using a PC, i-Pad, while Health and Wellbeing Advisor Cath Pollock is here the second Wednesday in the month offering 1:1 support.

Bellinge Youth Group is held on Tuesday evenings for 8-12 year-olds and 12-16 year-olds supporting our 53+ young people that access this service, along with the Monday evening street football sessions.

We have entered Northampton In Bloom - with lots of people from Bellinge Pre-School to local residents all taking part.

The next Parish Family Fun day will take place at Fieldmill Square on 22nd April and we hope to have attractions for you all to enjoy. Little Billing Pocket Park's Triumph and Tragedy

MANY favourable comments have been received following the installation of the new benches and picnic tables in Little Billing Pocket Park just before Christmas (see photo below).

This improvement was made possible as the Park Committee had successfully applied for a Tesco Bags of Help Grant. The other major purchase enabled by the Grant, a bright red Mountfield sit-on mower, was not, sadly, as successful.

Within hours of being delivered it was stolen from the container off Valley Road where the group stores its equipment.

The new mower was delivered at dusk on Monday, 30th January, and a passer-by must have taken a liking to it for, overnight on Tuesday/Wednesday, 31st January/1st February, the holding fitting within the lock-box on the container was sawn through with a hacksaw enabling the padlock to be removed, and the other padlocks on the main door were smashed-off and the mower, a chipper and other equipment were stolen.

Despite the noise and activity, nothing was heard by householders at neighbouring properties. So, if you spot anyone in the vicinity with a little garden and a nice new mower in the garage, please notify the Police by calling 101 and quoting Incident Number 205.
