

Have you noticed many litter picking volunteers. or red/purple bags on the side of the road ready for collection?

This is the work of The Northants Litter Wombles.

The wombles formed in January 2021 during the covid-19 pandemic, as a group they noticed the litter problem that plagues Northamptonshire.

Deciding enough was enough, this group of like-minded people forged their Facebook community. With the objective to rid Northampton of this issue one litter pick at a time.

The group are growing at a phenomenal rate, currently at 2700 members made up of over 35 groups in the county.

Their impact has been huge, collecting over 33,000 bags of litter, in additon to hundreds of tonnes of larger items from the towns and countryside this has saved the taxpayer over £1.2m.

Their aim is to eradicate litter in the parish. But to do this attitudes need to change and your help is needed. The only cure for litter is each and every one of us who live in the parish playing our part and not dropping litter in the first place.



## THE ELWES ARMS

An important part of the history of Great Billing, The Elwes Arms plans to continue to be a very important part of life in Great Billing.



### History

The Elwes Arms formally known as the Stag's Head which was built in 1629 and was owned by the Elwes family for 140 years before being sold.

The change of name to the Elwes Arms took place in January 1880. During the 1870s and 80s there was a rash of cases of drunken and unruly after hours drinking as well as one or two reports of drunken and unruly landlords!

### The community

For more than 35 years the Elwes Arms has been run

by the current team of Steve and Angie Marsh and has continued to be in the heart of the community. As well as football and darts teams



and thriving golf society the Elwes has always been at the forefront of fundraising activities and it is believed that over £250,000 in total has been raised for a number of good causes both national and local.

In 2022 the Elwes will start another fundraising programme, it hasn't yet been decided what funds will be raised for but look out for news on our Facebook.

Elwes is set to create a recipe collection made up of modern takes on traditional recipes submitted to the pub by customers and locals and published as a book with each of the 52 recipes that make it into the book being served for one week each on the pub's menu.
