

✓ athleen Forsyth who lived in Great Billing was awarded a British Empire Medal for her services to Northampton Festival of Dance in Her Majesty's Birthday Honours list in 2020 just three months before she died. Due to the Covid 19 Pandemic restrictions, the presenting of the medal had to be delayed and was finally presented posthumously to her husband Brian Forsyth on the 21st of October 2021 by Lord Lieutenant, Mr. James Saunders Watson.



Kathie initially became involved in Northampton Festival of Dance when her daughters started to compete in the competition, she then joined the committee where she remained for 40 years. For the last 25 years she became the committee's secretary and took on the mammoth task of organising and scheduling the six-day festival, which involved over 900 dancers of various genres aged between four and 21. Her involvement didn't stop there, on each day of the festival she would assist the adjudicators to record the marks and their comments which was all done by hand

In addition to her involvement with Northampton Dance Festival Kathie who had trained as a teacher also set up an infant school in Singapore for children of British Servicemen who were posted there, became a Governor of St. David's School, organised Meals on Wheels at Northampton General and Manfield hospitals and helped Guide Dogs for the blind and many other animal charities. Kathie was an amazing example of the selfless members of our community whose work deserves to be recognised.


Dog Fouling

Prior to COVID-19 the customers and staff at the Elwes Arms Public House in Great Billing' embarked on a fund-raising journey to purchase three defibrillators for the parish.

The first two purchased, one being resident in The Elwes Arms Public House in Great Billing which is accessible whenever the public house is open and the second is located on the wall of Ecton 1 between the Post Office and One in Ecton Brook. The Parish Council has topped up the charity fund amassed by the Elwes Arms Public House and has completed the purchase of a third machine. The Parish Council has also installed a new streetlamp adjacent to the telephone kiosk in High Street, Great Billing which will subsequently provide the power to keep the defibrillator from freezing during the winter months.

The defibrillators will be registered on The National Defibrillator Network database so they can be accessed in the event of an emergency. Thanks, and Congratulations to all those at the Elwes Arms Public House involved in the fundraising.

THE EXTENSION OF THE **VOI E-SCOOTER SCHEME**

In September it was announced by North and West Northamptonshire Councils that the year-long trial of Voi Scooters will be extended until March 2022. The Voi Scooter trial was launched in September 2020 with the vision to making Northamptonshire more sustainable. By encouraging the way people move around the County it could help to reduce noise, congestion and air pollution making it a more sustainable environment for us to all live.

Your Parish Council, however, has serious concerns regarding some user's actions particularly the abandonment of Scooters anywhere, the riding on pavements and a total disregard to pedestrians and other road users. The Parish Council have notified Voi of our concerns and are in the process of seeking a banning order for the use of the Scooters on any owned Parish land.

Concern is also shown for the apparent lack of enforcement by the relevant authorities.
