For All Northampton Saints Fans

Did you know that Billing Parish has a historical link with Munster?

Back in January 2009 the Parish Chairman, John Marlow, started researching the history of the Irish Thomond family following a stay with friends just outside of Limerick prior to a Munster verses Saints rugby game.

Whilst there, they were taking about Thomond Park, Munster's 26,000 seat home ground and it came to light that it was

named after the Earl of Thomond, whose home was at Bunratty Castle.

He discovered when arriving home that the sixth Earl of Thomond left the family home in 1646, and not only moved to the UK but had in fact moved into Great Billing to take up residence in the Manor House.

A permanent monument to the 6th Earl of Thomond can be found in the crypt at St Andrews Church in Great Billing Village.



New Defibrillator

A defibrillator has recently been installed in the old red telephone box on the High Street, Great Billing Village. It's a potential life-saver for the community, made possible thanks to a donation of £751.00 from the Elwes Arms Charity Fund, which covered a proportion of the cost.

It comes after the parish councils first defibrillator, also funded by Elwes Arms Charity Fund, was installed outside Ecton One in Ecton Brook in 2021 and the taking over of a second on Fieldmill Square, Bellinge following the closure of Bellinge Community House Charity.

All defibrillators – or Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) as it is formally known – can be accessed 24/7 by the community. They are all linked to the Northamptonshire Ambulance Service and when it's needed anyone who calls 999 in an emergency will be given the location and access code of the nearest defibrillator and full instructions on how to use it.

The British Heart Foundation (BHF) notes that around 30,000 people in the UK suffer a sudden cardiac arrest away from a hospital environment each year, so by having a defibrillator available it will significantly increase someone chance of survival.



What is a Kentish Man doing on Billing Parish Council?

We moved into Great Billing in 1997.

So how did I become a Councillor for Little Billing? The Summer Fete highlighted the shortage of people to do things and I simply said "If you need a hand, just shout". Clearly the wrong thing to say as here I am, just a matter of fitting me in to a vacancy where hopefully I can help "maintain and develop Billing Parish as a safe, thriving and sustainable community which is an attractive place in which to live, work and play".
