## Billing Fayre

Billing Parish once again ushered in the warm weather with the return of its popular annual Parish Fayre, organised by Billing Parish Council, on 24th June.

With 22 stalls to visit, there was plenty for everyone to enjoy; from donkey rides to bouncy castles, crockery smash and the newest addition: a Virtual Reality Simulator.

A bar provided by the Elwes Arms, BBQ by the 55th Little Billing Scouts and live music from *Blast from The Past* supplemented the day's entertainment.

There was also meant to be an RSPCA Dog Show, however, due to the forecast of extreme heat, it was decided that this should not go ahead. Billing Parish Council's Vice Chairman, Steve Rockall, said:

#### **Northants Litter Wombles**

The Northants Litter Wombles (NLW's) was formed in January 2021 following the lockdown period during the Covid 19 pandemic.

People went walking for their daily exercise and began to notice how littered Northamptonshire had become. Nicola Elliott, our founder, started a Facebook group which has rapidly grown to some 3,500 members. Up to June 2023 we have collected a staggering **62,870 bags of litter**, improving the environment both for people and wildlife alike and saving the taxpayer over £3 million.

We strongly believe that everyone deserves to live, work, study and play in a place free of litter. It improves the well-being of all and helps to engender pride in local communities and improves the local economy as companies want to invest in the county and tourism blossoms. Unfortunately, our problem is caused by people who think it is acceptable to throw their litter out of car windows, drop their drink can or crisp packet or fly tip their rubbish in the hedgerows for someone else to clear up, including numerous bottles of urine discarded by lorry drivers onto the verges of our main roads.

Our group, named after the famous TV programme, is a group of ordinary people doing the extraordinary every day, who say "enough is enough" and take positive action to clean up our towns and countryside for the benefit of all. We pride ourselves on a 'can do' attitude.

We work through our 40 or so affiliated sub groups throughout Northamptonshire whether it be in the major towns, villages or hamlets. We also educate children and young adults through our school's programme 'Creating Litter Education and Awareness in Northamptonshire' (CLEAN). To this end, we provide schools and uniformed groups with a free 30 minute assembly/presentation



which is informative, engaging, interactive and challenging. By involving children in caring about the problem that litter causes, we aim to encourage and empower them to change their habits and those of the people around them. So far we have reached around 10,000 children across Northamptonshire and have more assemblies booked in. We also follow up with litter picking sessions to support and encourage the children. We use our limited funds to buy little purple Wombles jackets and pickers, which the children love to use!

### A Welcome Visitor

A Muntjac Deer, which are also known as 'the barking deer' because of their dog-like calls, has been spotted in and around Great Billing. They are usually a solitary animal and are normally difficult to spot as they tend to only be active at night. They are notorious browsers, eating the shoots from shrubs as well as woodland herbs and brambles in parkland and, in this case, a garden.

They are the smallest of the deer family in the UK and only stand around half a metre tall at the shoulder (about the size of a Labrador), but have a stocky build. They tend to be a russet brown colour, but in the winter months turn to a dull grey.

The species was introduced to Woburn Park from China by John Russell Reeves in 1838, but, due to a number of deer escaping in the 1920s, they rapidly spread into the surrounding areas, including Northamptonshire.

## Who is your clerk?

Do you know your parish clerk?

This is the person who works with your councillors to make sure that Billing Council provides the services you need in your local neighbourhood. They run the council meetings to which you are invited and is skilled in a range of disciplines to make sure the council runs properly and within the law. They'll be the ones writing to your local MP, liaising with the unitary council about changes to speed limits, car parking and potholes, applying for funding grants for local projects, researching complex planning issues, running the council's finances and managing community buildings and events. They're good in a crisis too!

Clerks are professionals and serve around 10,000 local councils in England and Wales. These councils emerged in 1894 to give a democratic voice to local people and they've changed enormously in that time, particularly during the last 20–30 years. They are real place shapers and, today, many manage and maintain parks, sports facilities, skateparks and recreation grounds, play areas, allotments, community and youth centres, car parks, public toilets, cemeteries, street cleaning, run events and much more. Most of all, clerks and councillors are advocates – the voice for their communities.

Whatever your local council is delivering for your community, your clerk will be at the heart of getting it done. They provide the services that we all notice the most in our neighbourhoods but, disappointingly, they're often not properly recognised for just how much they do.
